Fletcher Pilon **Singer- songwriter** *The Graeme Anderson Award for Excellence*
From Wamberal, Fletcher is well on the way to creating a career in music and fulfilling his ambition to being the headline act in big arena concerts.

Kasey Barnes **Musical Theatre**
In 2022 Kasey visited London and New York on study tour. She is a high achiever academically and musically, having played in 15 Gosford Musical Society shows plus others in Sydney. She has been spotted by West End producer Jason Haigh Ellery and wants to pursue studies in a UK theatre school.

Jacinta-Rose Burley **Musical Theatre**
Jacinta-Rose has been supported by BFA for the last 4 years. She has an interest in all aspects of Musical Theatre and has shown determination against considerable difficulties. Her grant will be used to strengthen areas to give her all-round theatrical skills.

Kelly Griffith **Singer-songwriter**
Kelly's stage name is Elaskia. She is a singer-songwriter whose songs have featured in the American TV show 'Dynasty' and the Australian show 'Home and Away.' She is studying for a Diploma of Music and hopes to soon tour within Australia and overseas.

Gab Paananen **Visual Artist** *The Graeme Anderson Award*

Gab is an extravagantly talented artist: as a puppet constructor and puppeteer, sculptor, artist, illustrator, taxidermist, conservationist, and animatronicist. She has received several BFS grants allowing her to develop her skills to the highest degree both here and overseas

Ella Powell **Singer-songwriter** *Graeme Anderson Encouragement Award*

A Country Pop singer-songwriter from Terrigal, Ella was the Peoples Choice winner at the 2019 Tamworth Country Music Festival and is currently working on recording new songs.

Abbey Toole **Singer-songwriter** *The Bill Hayward Award*

Abbey is a 21 year-old singer-songwriter-guitarist with the Central Coast band "Little Quirks", an all-female folk-rock band achieving success internationally and which has signed with a New York record Company. The group will tour Europe in 2022 and the grant will help with high touring costs.

Eliza Williams **Classical Dancer** *Helen Ferguson Memorial Award*

Eliza is in the second year of a three year course at the Berlin Dance Institute studying Martha Graham, ballet and contemporary dance techniques. She has shown great determination to persevere through COVID disruptions. BFA has supported Eliza since she was 16.

Jack Williams Dancer and Theatrical Performer *John & Merran Adams Award*

Jack is a multi-talented dancer, singer, model and drag artist currently studying at NAISDA Dance College. They have performed for the “Big Rainbow Project”, the first big reach-out to the LGBTQIA+ community in remote and rural Australia and has also appeared as a runway model at the Australian Fashion Week. As a weekly volunteer, Jack teaches Indigenous dance to Aboriginal kids in Redfern.
